ManorCon XXIX

15th to 18th July 2011 Stamford Hall, University of Leicester

The organization for ManorCon XXIX is proceeding well. If you haven't booked yet, remember that you can do so in two ways. You can book online via PayPal or a credit or debit card – visit http://www.manorcon.org.uk/book.htm and follow the links. Or you can still post a form and cheque – the form can be found at the same place if you need one. Please remember that **advance registration is only available until 11th June.** After this, you will have to register at the door and pay higher registration fees and accommodation charges (and you may not get any accommodation at all – our supply of rooms is fairly limited).

If you have booked, but need to cancel all or some of your booked accommodation, you should inform us as soon as possible. If you cancel by the booking deadline, then you will definitely avoid cancellation charges. Thereafter, the later you leave it to inform us, the more likely you are to suffer accommodation cancellation charges.

ManorCon is run by volunteers, and does not aim to make a profit. In order for us to keep this tradition, we ask for volunteers for a number of tasks. One of these is help with the registration desk, usually by manning the desk for an hour on the Friday afternoon. Now that we hand out keys in addition to handling on-the-door bookings, we need lots of volunteers! If anybody asks anything you don't know, just point them at the nearest committee member – it's not difficult. If you would like to help us out and failed to mention it when booking, please e-mail us at regdesk@manorcon.org.uk.

This year, as usual, we will have a mix of scheduled and ad-hoc tournaments, plus some other competitions and events.

Scheduled tournaments:

Croquet – knock-out tournament limited to a maximum of 16 players.

Diplomacy – individual rounds at 1800 on Friday, 1000 on Saturday, and 1000 on Sunday. In addition to the main tournament, there is also the **Diplomacy Challenge**, an individual one round tournament based solely on scores in the Saturday round. This replaces the team round from previous years.

Midnight Party – three rounds, at midnight each evening.

Other events:

Games Stall. Milestone Games will again run a games stall for new games and gaming accessories. They will provide a 15% discount to all purchases, and there will be some special offers as well. **Pop Quiz** – on Saturday evening.

Second Hand Games Sale – We hope to have two sessions, on Friday and Saturday. Unfortunately, Richard Frost, who normally organises the SHGS, has family commitments on the

weekend. We therefore require a volunteer to step forward to organise it this year. Richard can arrange for SHGS supplies to be available, and the normal helpers should be available. If nobody steps forward, we shall have no option but to cancel this popular event. So, could we have a volunteer, please?

Treasure Hunt – on Sunday afternoon. "Pit your mental and physical abilities against tests of skill in a race against time across four zones to unlock the mystery of this year's treasure hunt!"

Please note that, for several reasons, including the need to ensure there is sufficient space, the selling of games other than via the Games Stall or the Second Hand Games Sale should not be done without permission from the ManorCon Committee (contact details below).

There will be trophies for: 1st to 3rd in the Diplomacy, Dominion, and 18XX, and the winners of the Acquire, Croquet, Diplomacy Challenge, Puerto Rico, Race for the Galaxy, and St Petersburg competitions.

MidCon XXXII Report (Jeremy Tullett)

MidCon XXXIII takes place in the comfortable Hallmark Hotel in Derby from Friday morning (11am) to Sunday evening (6pm).

MidCon is about playing games and meeting people. You can play any of the number of games people bring along with them, including the hot new games from the Spiel games fair in Essen, which takes place just a few weeks before MidCon. Popular games include 18XX, Puerto Rico, Power Grid and Agricola, but you are welcome to bring along your own favourite games – you will almost certainly find some people willing to play at least one of them.

The convention features:

- the opportunity to play board games with other gamers
- the MidCon general knowledge quiz for teams of 4 on Saturday evening
- a games shop
- a Bring & Buy stall where you can sell your games, or pick up a bargain

Costs

Attendance at **Mid**Con costs £17-£20 for the whole weekend (day rates of £10 for each of Friday, Saturday and Sunday) and accommodation is available in the Hallmark Hotel or its sister establishment, the European Inn across the road, at reasonable rates. Both hotels have dedicated, free, car parks.

Derby railway station is about 50 metres away, and there is a bus link from there to East Midlands airport.

The City

Derby has a new Westfield centre for shoppers, and old 'cathedral quarter', and a number of interesting museums. There are at least two dining areas in the city (one near to the hotels), and a busy nightlife as well as several 'real ale' pubs.

Registration Fee

£17 per person for the whole weekend, when booked before 1st November, £20 afterwards, and on the door. A single registration fee covers both MidCon, and EuroDipCon, which is part of the event this year. The day rate is £10 per day. Please note: convention fees are not refundable.

Our block booking is held until 14th October, so YOU ARE ADVISED TO BOOK AS EARLY AS

POSSIBLE.

After November 1st we will not be able to accept postal bookings, and accommodation will have to be booked directly with the hotel, whilst the convention fee will have to be paid at the convention

Progress on Expo

We have had a busy few months since the last issue of QLA. Trade is 99% sold out, only one stand remains unsold, with plenty of board game companies attending, we expect to be fully sold out very soon. We have made changes to the way we handle entry to the show, especially on Saturday morning. I well remember the crush and queues of 2010 and we really want to do our best to avoid this in 2011. If you pre-book entry and tournament tickets then from about 8am on Saturday morning there will be a collection point at the rear of the Clarendon Suite, this is in addition to collection on Friday if you are in the area. Here you can collect tickets prior to entering Expo. Once the doors open at 9.30am you will be able to enter both at the rear and the front entrances. So our advice is to pre-book and collect your tickets to avoid queuing.

Game Companies

Go to our website to find details of who will be exhibiting at Expo 2011, currently 76 traders are committed to attend the show; there are links to many of their websites on our Exhibitors page.

We are planning a designated area for developers of new games to have prototypes of their games on display for feedback and play testing, so that you can be involved in the development of the games you will be playing in 2011 and beyond. We are also hosting an area for authors to display their work, with a number of authors already signed up to attend.

Board Game Events

Keep checking our website page for details of tournaments. Currently we have David Norman's Grand Board Games Tournament, also Barry Ingram is running his Memoir 44 and Command and Colours Ancients Tournaments. These are in addition to the UK Carcassonne Championship, the Agricola Championship and the UK Settlers of Catan Championship. We also have tournaments in addition to the above – Powergrid, St Petersburg and Puerto Rico, keep checking, there may be more coming.

An exciting addition for 2011 is a Living Munchkin event based on the mega-hit card game. Rather than draw and play cards the game is played out in real time. This event is fully supported by Steve Jackson Games, using original artwork, and we are working on having unique prizes through sponsorship from Steve Jackson Games. Look out for this event when our booking system goes live, around Easter weekend – spaces are limited and we know the event will be a sell-out.

The list of new games premiering at Expo is growing by the week, also there will be prototypes for you to see and play, including releases from Cubicle 7, Surprised Stare and many more. There will be a dedicated play test area in the purple zone.

We are also developing on last year's seminar schedule. Currently we have 8 seminars across Saturday and Sunday – too many to mention, they are listed on our website. There will be a board game designers' panel on Saturday afternoon and on Sunday Lewis Pulsipher will be giving tips on how to design a good board game. We also have Steve Jackson and Ian Livingstone back at Expo to talk about their favourite games.

Accommodation

The Clarendon Suites have no hotel accommodation. However, within 500 yards are many hotels. Our website has details of those nearby, here is the link:
