### **Editorial (Jeremy Tullett)**

Come Christmas, come the board game.

I have been playing board games since I was about 12, much to the amusement of my family, who never really could see the point. Indeed, even now, now mother has a hard time taking any of my games seriously when I try to introduce them to her, and being goaded simultaneously by both her and my not-mother-in-law is a bit more than I can take, even at Christmas.

Hence this Christmas's purchase – **Miskatonic School for Girls** – had to wait for its first outing until a New Year visit to Edinburgh, and the warm hospitality of John and Denny Colledge.

MSfG gets some decidedly mixed reviews on *boardgamegeek* but still scores a rating of 5.59/10, which hardly puts it in the rubbish category. It is in the Dominion class of games where the cards in your hand have, according to the phase, purchasing power, or combat power. The idea is to buy 'good' cards (schoolgirls) to protect the sanity of your school house, while purchasing horrors loosely from the Cthulu mythos to place in the staff room of the player to your left, and drive their school house mad.

Now, it seems to me that *boardgamegeek* reviewers play games to death very quickly (well ... they are geeks), and I can see where their criticisms come from. There is not a great deal of strategic choice to play, and there are certain design features which either don't feature at all in play, or are of limited value. The apparently superfluous features have been explained by the designers as being possibly of use for future expansions, although there don't appear to be any expansions planned.

However, it is a bit harsh criticising a game for what it surely is not intended to be. Would you buy a game with this title, illustrated with comic-strip schoolgirls, and expect a serious game of strategy and tactics? No! It lasts about 45 minutes, and is ideal for bringing out as a time-filler at a convention or at your local games club. Anyone who tells me that it is too silly for serious gamers probably doesn't remember the mania for Pass the Pigs that swept through the gaming community a while back.

My birthday is approaching rapidly, and I am looking with interest at **1812: The Invasion of Canada**, which, we can safely assume, will be a little more serious.

### MidCon 2012 Review and Future Plans (Paul Oakes)

Our second *Mid*Con at The Hallmark Hotel in Derby was an even bigger success than the first, with 169 registering (142 for the whole 3 days) comparing to the 2011 figure of 129 - a 10% increase, meaning once again we're the fastest-growing board games convention in Britain. The 2011 figure was also boosted by EuroDipCon giving us a one-off gain of over 20 Diplomacy players who came specifically for the event. It's fair to say we are happy with this level of support, with numbers not seen at the event since the mid-90s.

This rate of growth surprised us and has led to a problem of our size causing a shortage of gaming space. On Saturday the hotel kindly added extra games tables in the lounge (a room we don't pay for) while several card games were being played in the bar. This is preferable to the half-empty feeling at The Angus as recently as 6 years ago, but we aim to provide suitable playing space for everyone, so we will have more rooms next MidCon, and will hire additional space on Saturday if it is similarly overcrowded.

Other than that we are unaware of any problems with the event, but if there is something you want to raise please reply to the editor and let us know. We no longer hand out feedback forms as the

information they provide is difficult to act on (an overall rating of 7.2/10 hardly gives us a plan of action after all), but we are very keen to know about specific problems and what we can do to address them. We do spend hours agonising over the booklet, T-shirts, food, drink and the weather forecast for the weekend, so be assured anything you want that is within our capabilities will be looked at.

Side effects of the size of the event were a quiz so popular it barely fitted into the room (5 years ago there were 4 teams) and 10 polypins (360 pints) of proper beer being put to good use in addition to the consumption of other, inferior bar products. We had no negative reports of the food quality/quantity at the buffet.

Almost as important, the hotel seem to love us. As long-term inmates of *Mid*Con will remember The Angus (arch.) sometimes had managers who regarded us as a hostile invading army and applied different standards to us than other guests present at the time (pre-paying for rooms, no drinks on room tabs etc.). With a competent management and staff on our side the entire experience from an attending and organising viewpoint is immeasurably better, and this approach combined with the superior hotel in a mostly more convenient location has led to the gratifying explosion in attendance you don't expect from such an established con.

We have booked the hotel for the 2013 event, you'll be surprised to hear, with the dates of 8th - 10th November.

Also, in a moment of madness, we are considering adding a second *Mid*Con each year in the spring. The earliest we can do this is 2014, but we need to know what level of support there is for an extra *Mid*Con, as a badly attended event will be a financial disaster. We set the convention fee to breakeven in the long run by raising the price when we lose money, then leaving it there as our costs go up until we suffer losses again. As a result we do not have huge cash reserves to fund a large deficit, so need to have some idea of the level of support we would get from you.

Therefore, with MidCon in the March – May period and assuming the date didn't clash with something else you do, would you:

- Only attend the "classic" November event.
- Switch to the shiny new Spring *Mid*Con
- Find time to go to both.

We emphasise this is still just an idea, but if there isn't support from you then we can save ourselves the trouble of further arrangements. We do not expect New *Mid*Con to be as large as the current event (initially, anyway) so will scale things down somewhat, but otherwise it should be a similar experience with warmer weather.

One or more of the committee are at virtually every board games convention in England throughout the year, and we also welcome face-to-face feedback at appropriate times at these events we attend merely to criticise their distance from the train station etc. As stated above, if there's something you can suggest to improve the event we'll try to do it!

### MANORCON XXXI

John Foster Hall, University of Leicester.

2pm Friday 19th July – 2pm Monday 22nd July 2013

Following on from last year's successful convention, ManorCon will once again be held at the University of Leicester in 2013 – but at John Foster Hall, just across the road from our previous location at Stamford Hall. John Foster Hall was built only a few years ago; all the main meeting rooms are in one building, and the main dining hall, where the core of the convention will be, is much bigger than it was at Stamford. No more crowding in Stamford House late at night, or dashing through the rain (if the weather is poor) between the bar and the servery!

As ever, single accommodation is available at the convention. As it is more modern than Stamford Hall, John Foster Hall only has en-suites, but these will not cost much more than the standard singles did last year: £34 per night, and £3 per night extra if you don't book in advance. As always, you are therefore recommended to book early to guarantee a room.

For those people who want twin accommodation, we recommend The Regency Hotel, which is just under a mile from the convention. The contact details are: The Regency Hotel, 360 London Road, Stonygate, LE2 2PL 0116 270 9634. It offers double rooms (currently £70 per night). If you want to take this option, we recommend booking early, as it has been known to fill up on ManorCon weekend. Their website is www.the-regency-hotel.com.

ManorCon will be pretty much the same as the successful formula we had in 2012. Running from Friday lunchtime to Monday lunchtime, it will have all the regular tournaments, plus one or two possible new ones – depending on the success (or otherwise) of the latest new game releases. It will once again feature the Second Hand Game Sale on Friday and Saturday, the Pop Quiz on Saturday evening, and the Treasure Hunt on Sunday afternoon, as well as more games than you can shake a stick at.

Tournaments will include: Diplomacy, 18XX, Dominion, Puerto Rico, St Petersburg, 7 Wonders, Midnight Party, and Croquet. If there is a tournament that you would like us to run, please contact a member of the committee and we'll try to fit it in. There will also be plenty of non-tournament games on offer – far too numerous to mention!

There is of course a bar, and we are working to make sure that the Real Ale is up to standard.
