John Langley writes:

"There are a small number of U.K. players looking for a home. We used to play standard Dip and Intimate Dip (2 player Dip) vía the old 'zines. In recent years one or two of us have used an American site called DiplomaticCorps which is not bad, but looks like it might fold as it's not been updated for a while. That only seems to leave sites like PlayDiplomacy, which seem to run to very short deadlines.

"We wondered if you knew of anyone running play by email games to approx one week deadlines? We had also considered recruit for such games by word of mouth or even perhaps by putting something in QLA if you would allow this."

MidCon 2019 (Jeremy Tullett)

MidCon 2019 had a record number of registrations, finishing on a headcount of 280.

Last minute changes to the availability of the Hallmark Inn resulted in us swapping the Inn dining room for the dining room and Wine Room area of the Hallmark Hotel, which seemed to me to be an improvement.

The only problem here was the apparent double booking of the dining room for a pre-wedding party. This could have led to a lot of grief as the guests mixed with the gamers in the bar and lounge, but there were no difficulties reported to me.

The dinner guests were apparently on room-only terms, but it appears that many of them turned up for Sunday breakfast anyway, which, unsurprisingly, exacerbated the usual Sunday morning staffing problems.

I had only one complaint about behaviour, but it was never demonstrated that the individual concerned was a part of the convention rather than the wedding party, so thank you all for behaving so well.

A couple of you got caught with parking fines, although in at least one case, I think there was a foolish assumption in play. The notices on the parking machines should be taken at face value, and you cannot just stop for even a few minutes without paying. All convention attendees need to register their cars at the appropriate reception desk (Inn or Hotel) to benefit from reduced or free rates, whether day visitors or residents.

A number of you kindly donated unsold games from the Bring and Buy for me to give to charity, or to sell with the proceeds to go to charity. I can report that some games went directly to a local charity shop. Some simpler games in good condition were donated to a charity that collects Xmas presents for deprived children in Derby, and I have managed to sell some on eBay for modest sums. The proceeds are in a tin on my shelf waiting for an opportunity for a donation. The remainder were offered to the **Mid**Con games library. Actually – they are now the **Mid**Con games library.

MidCon 2020 (Jeremy Tullett)

The contract is confirmed for 13-15 November. I am awaiting a booking code for the website, and the contract also needs to be varied to account for the use of the Hotel dining room, rather than that of the Inn.

I am also awaiting the dates that are available for 2021. If 2020 is bigger again than 2019, we will need to find extra space somewhere, although the Aston Court would probably do as a short-term expedient for extra space.

MANORCON XXXVIII

Stamford Court, University of Leicester. 2pm Friday 17th July – 2pm Monday 20th July 2020

Following on from last year's successful convention, ManorCon will once again be held at the University of Leicester. The gaming halls will remain at Stamford Court with accommodation nearby.

Please note, ManorCon does not start until 2pm on Friday. In recent years, people have been arriving earlier and earlier, to the extent that it has started to interfere with the convention preparation on Friday morning. The University needs to adapt the venue to our set up and thus it is unlikely that there will be space available for anyone arriving before 2pm.

As ever, single accommodation is available at the convention. All rooms are en-suite rooms. These will cost £44 per night, and £8 per night extra if you don't book in advance. As always, you are therefore recommended to book early to guarantee a room.

For those people who want twin accommodation, we recommend The Regency Hotel, which is just under a mile from the convention. The contact details are: The Regency Hotel, 360 London Road, Stonygate, LE2 2PL; 0116 270 9634. If you want to take this option, we recommend booking early, as it has been known to fill up on ManorCon weekend. Their website is www.the-regency-hotel.com.

ManorCon will be pretty much the same as the successful formula we've had in previous years. Running from Friday lunchtime to Monday lunchtime, it will have all the regular tournaments, plus one or two possible new ones, depending on the success (or otherwise) of the latest new game releases. It will once again feature the Second Hand Game Sale on Friday and Saturday, the Pop Quiz on Saturday evening, and the Treasure Hunt on Sunday afternoon, as well as more games than you can shake a stick at.

Tournaments will include 18XX and Midnight Party. If there is a tournament that you would like us to run, please contact a member of the committee and we'll try to fit it in. There will also be plenty of non-tournament games on offer far too numerous to mention!

There is, of course, a bar, and we are working to make sure that the Real Ale is up to standard.
